### **News from the Committee Meeting November**

Our duty operator morning briefing has now got a checklist to work through. The main points raised were speed and around the track, especially on the viaduct, and also following distances. Both really important safety items especially when we are running for the public in a public space. Drivers – we really need to make sure we are focusing on what is in front of us.

Our club lathe is to be sold. Yet again there has been ongoing debate on this subject but it was unanimously agreed by the committee that the sale go ahead.

Russell is going to look into changing the valve system on Black Magic to simplify its operation.

Ridecars – Bogies are getting swapped out when problems show (usually worn brake blocks). This is great as we now have spare units. Another ridecar point is that we need to ensure that they kept are within their allocated consists so that we can keep our WOF system in some kind of order. Finally, please do not remove safety chains from ridecars, these are a very important piece of safety equipment and all ridecars must be attached to each other with 2 chains.

Station Operators – Please remember to load ridecars sensibly with an even distribution of weight along the car. Loading ridecars is key to preventing random derailments. To put it tactfully we need the heavier passengers towards the middle of the cars not right at the front or right at the back, this keeps a more even spread of weight across the car and stops the bogies jumping off.

Signals now have brighter LEDs and there is also a new red signal. All this extra lighting should be a help to drivers, but please look where you are going. It is always a good idea to your right as you come onto the viaduct to see if there is already someone on there.

All nuts and bolts etc in the workshop have been sorted, labelled and tidied – Thank you to Phil Adnitt for a job well done.

XMAS DO – Pencil in Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> February for the Xmas do up at Bruce Harvey's place (by then he may know of this plan). Usual BBQ and bring your toys along.
