

Presidents Report - May 2023

My first big thank you this month is to Warren K for his absolute beavering on everything secretary related. The second big thank you is to Sandra O who has taken on the treasurer role and is now getting her head around Xero.

We have had a drama this month with some lowlife pinching the padlocks that secure the viaduct. They are doing this by breaking the slide bolt tang. The padlocks were replaced, only to go missing again within a day or two. To put this into perspective, this is now \$800 worth of padlocks as these are all keyed alike high security locks. Much discussion had taken place on how to prevent this. It's thought that they are after the brass locks, but I gather it's a council requirement that the viaduct is locked. This padlock issue has annoyed me



immensely.

Our submission presented by Chris P to the council has had a pleasing result - the council and planners have agreed to come down and talk with us and to see how bulldozing our clubrooms and a lump of our track will impact our club. It interested me that our councillors had no idea of what this proposed development would do to our club.

Congratulations to Ross, his boiler has passed its final test. Team, to anyone who has built a boiler, this is a BIG day. Well done Ross. I suspect we will see a really nice traction engine take shape now, as with a traction engine everything bolts onto the boiler.

A member of the public has dropped into the club with a partially completed 3 1/2" AB Loco, now located on the club table. He would like to sell it. Is anyone interested in completing it? His phone number is in the box of bits that came with it.

Black Magic is in the workshop getting major surgery. Russell and I have up-spec'd the hydraulics and now the bogies are getting basically rebuilt - we are going away from alloy side frames to steel plate, and the bearings will now be of the pivot type. The hydraulic motors are now in series, this will really help traction going up the viaduct on wet track as all wheels are driving all the time.

A group of us went up to Manukau to play trains, Trent was driving my Phantom and Ethan driving everything he could get his hands on. It was interesting to me that all the steamers were clinkering up - a problem that I thought was unique to my Phantom. We had a very informative chat with Dave Giles after a really nice meal.

The model train club has invited us to their event on the 20th of January. This is a really high calibre show. If anyone has layouts in the spare room (?), time to dust them off. Jason would be the man to see if you want details.

Once again, if you are interested, contact Warren.






