



## In memory of Peter McDonald-Jones

# Peter with "Virginia"

From before age 16, when he was accepted as an apprentice into the NZ Government Railways Otahuhu Workshops, , it could be said that Peter lived and breathed steam locomotives.

Until his untimely passing late last year, Peter was heavily involved with "railways". Not only was he a foundation member of our club (1st July 1979), he was also a founding member of the Glen Afton (Huntly) Bush Tramway at Pukemiro, and led the restoration of the 1887 Avonside built L class 2-4-0T Engine Number 508, at the Tauranga Historic Village, prior to it moving to Shantytown, where it operates to this day.

He was also a founding member of the Tauranga Citizens Club and President of his other love, the NZ Vauxhall Car Club.

From chasing trains for photographs, setting up a track in his Auckland home driveway for all the neighbouring kids to enjoy, to assisting at the Panmure Basin miniature railway, Peter just LOVED trains Forming a friendship, with other like-minded fellow railway workers, to found the club we know today, Peter, Bev and family finally settled into Omanawa in 1994, thereafter taking on the Club Presidents role and overseeing all subsequent staged club track expansions.

Only after the last extension was built, including two new trestle bridges and embankments, did he finally relinquish the position of Club President - an unprecedented and continuous dedication lasting 23 years, however remaining as the club's MEANZ Representative and Boiler Inspector.

Peter's immense knowledge of all aspects of railways and more especially steam, was imparted to all budding miniature locomotive builders. He ensured that any club boiler built met his stringent requirements to gain and operate with a recognised Steam Boiler Certificate.

Nobody would have been more satisfied than Peter, when the Club won the Supreme Award at the 2016 Trustpower Tauranga Community Awards, an acknowledgment of the impact the club has upon the local public who flock every Sunday for a train ride!

Peter was an unassuming gentleman and always reiterated it was the club and all the members, not just himself, that have made and created the club we have today.

Thank you Peter.

### TMMEC CAD DRAWING --- SEEKING EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST --- - Owen Bennett

At a recent General Meeting of members, it was agreed for the Club to invest in a computer, capable of dealing with CAD (Computer Aided Design) Drawing software. So enabling members to learn CAD Drawing, produce DXF files for Laser Cutting objects, and STL files for creating 3D objects, either as working items, or parts for projects. Dimensioned drawings may also be produced for publication through the Newsletter, or emailed to others elsewhere. Introducing a new skill into our model engineering hobby will hopefully inject new life and challenges for our current members, also attracting new and younger members to our wider hobby.

We now have a suitable Computer, with CAD software installed. Fusion 360 was suggested as suitable, being free (with restrictions) but is still has to be organised.

The club has also approved the purchase of a 3D Printer, a suitable model still to be decided upon by the committee in the near future.

A legitimate copy of SolidWorks, supplied by a club member is already installed. Owen has completed a Level 3 SolidWorks Polytech course 10 years ago but memory has dimmed somewhat. He still has the Course material available. A small number of other club members are proficient with this program.

Learning 3D CAD requires time and effort. The journey satisfies the pleasure of learning new skills required to create a solid models of your ideas or mechanical projects, similar to learning other computer programmes, like word processing, etc. CAD programmes can change 2D drawn objects into 3D solid models. Anything you can see or imagine can thereafter be laser-cut or 3D printed. All CAD programmes work similarly, so once you understand the "Features" of each programme you are well on the way to producing CAD Drawings.

Both Fusion 360 and SolidWorks are available for hobbyists to download to your own computer but the downloaded version of SolidWorks is unlikely to be compatible with the club's installed version. (Ed – I have done so on my home computer, but have yet to try it out.)

Also installed is FreeCAD an Open Source programme, similar in capability to SolidWorks, under development for the last 20 years or so, and already very good. Owen has been using this for some years. FreeCAD is freely available to download, the current stable version is 0.21. Available for Apple, Windows, and other platforms. The first complete version is soon to be released.

Microsoft Publisher, as part of MS Office, offers 2D drawing for less complex projects, a quicker means of achieving accurate drawings. Owen has also used Publisher's capabilities extensively for his Phantom and Little Phanny projects, also other projects. He prefers to produce drawings to actual size for direct ruler measurements.

Makerspace in Tauranga, is well equipped and can do custom jobs with a sizeable Laser Cutting machine to cut a wide variety of media - 3mm plywood, plastic, MDF, etc. to produce your creations very cheaply.

I have a project in mind. A 3.5inch laser-cut and 3d printed battery operated locomotive for use on the raised track. Exciting!

It is envisioned that designated Tuesday evenings would be an appropriate time to have hands-on lessons on CAD. Other days and times could be organised by arrangement.


