showcase another part of our club. A Working Bee will be needed for our raised track changes.

We also have our MEANZ audit this month, all locos need to have speedos fitted as part of this. Warren K is trying to find out from Rex Thoms if this is a specific audit requirement. Audit is 24th March.

Warren K will organise nomination forms to be available in the club house, they will be on the smoko table.

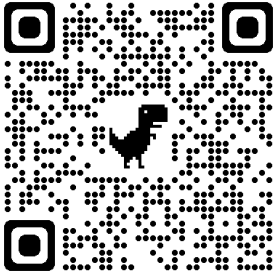

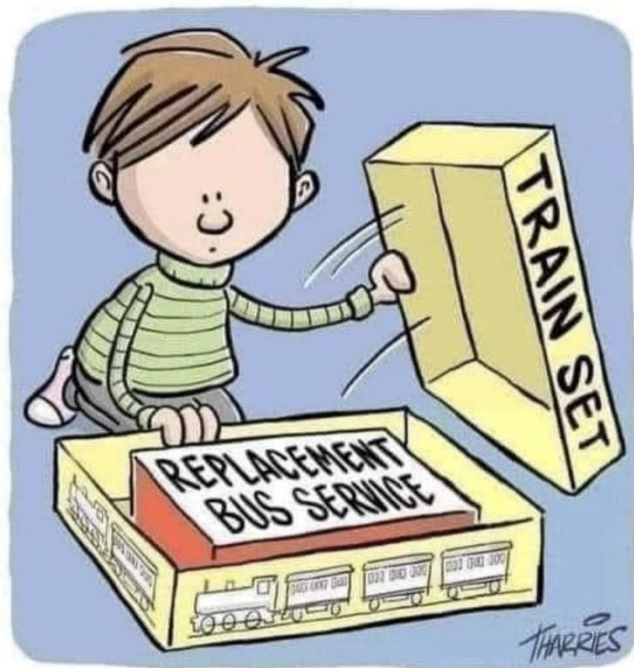
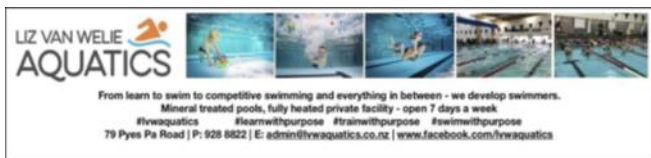
